

# YOUR RIGHTS

- ◆ You may not be treated differently because of your **RACE, COLOR, NATIONAL ORIGIN, DISABILITY, AGE or SEX (GENDER)**
- ◆ You have the right to receive information in a language that you understand at no cost to you.
- ◆ If you have a disability and need program information in an alternate format, you have the right to receive it at no cost to you.

**If you feel you have been treated differently by this agency because of your race, color, national origin, disability, political affiliation, religion, citizenship, age or sex you may file a complaint with:**
